
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


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The phonics sound finder is based solely upon <u>picture cues</u> to help determine the sound the phonogram makes. It is not based upon actual spelling. (i.e. chair is shown under ch and tch because of its initial sound. If a child begins to pronounce the picture, they should arrive at the correct sound of the phonogram.

Tip: Run through the pictures and make sure student knows what each picture represents. Use when student encounters a unknown or forgotten phonogram.
